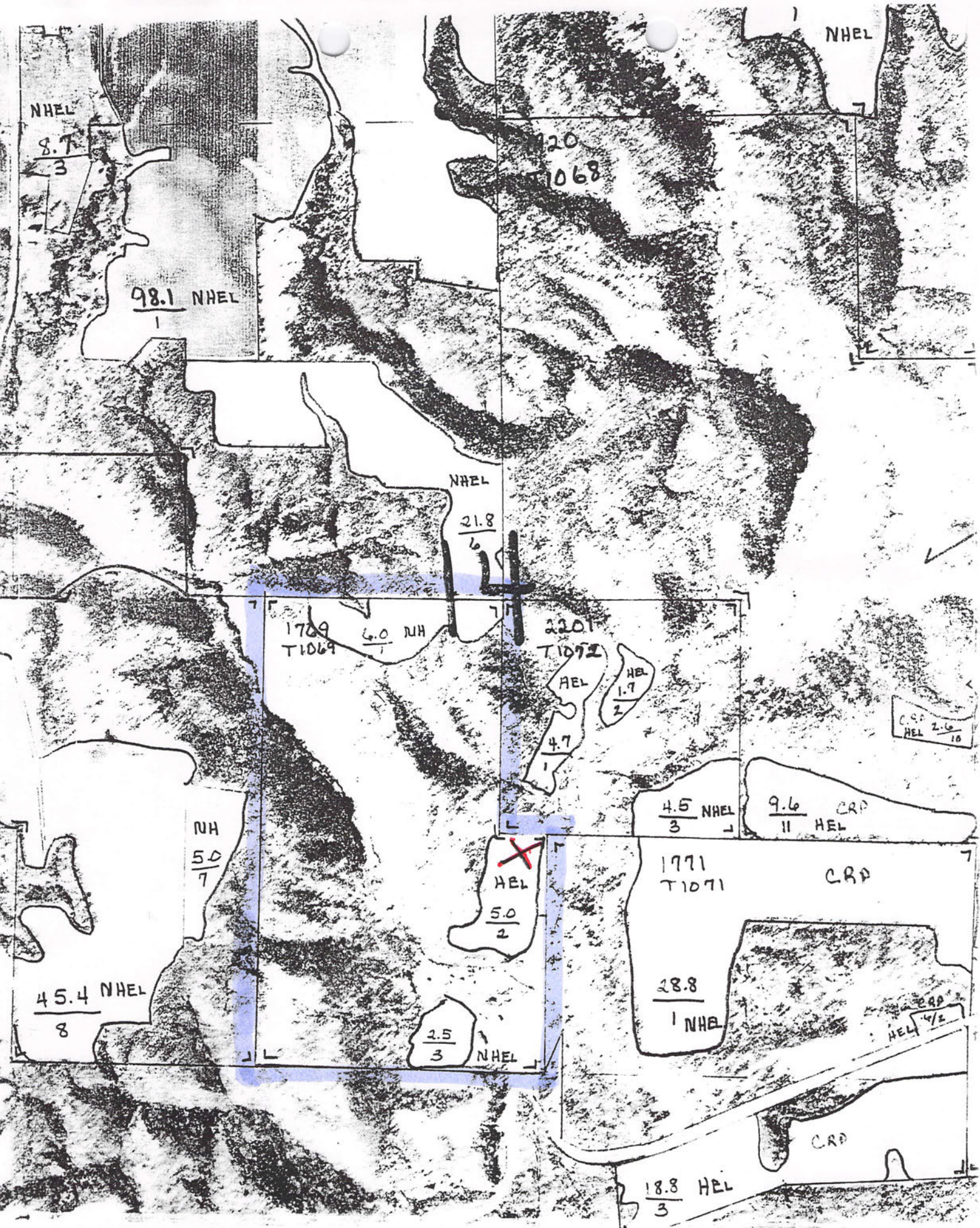

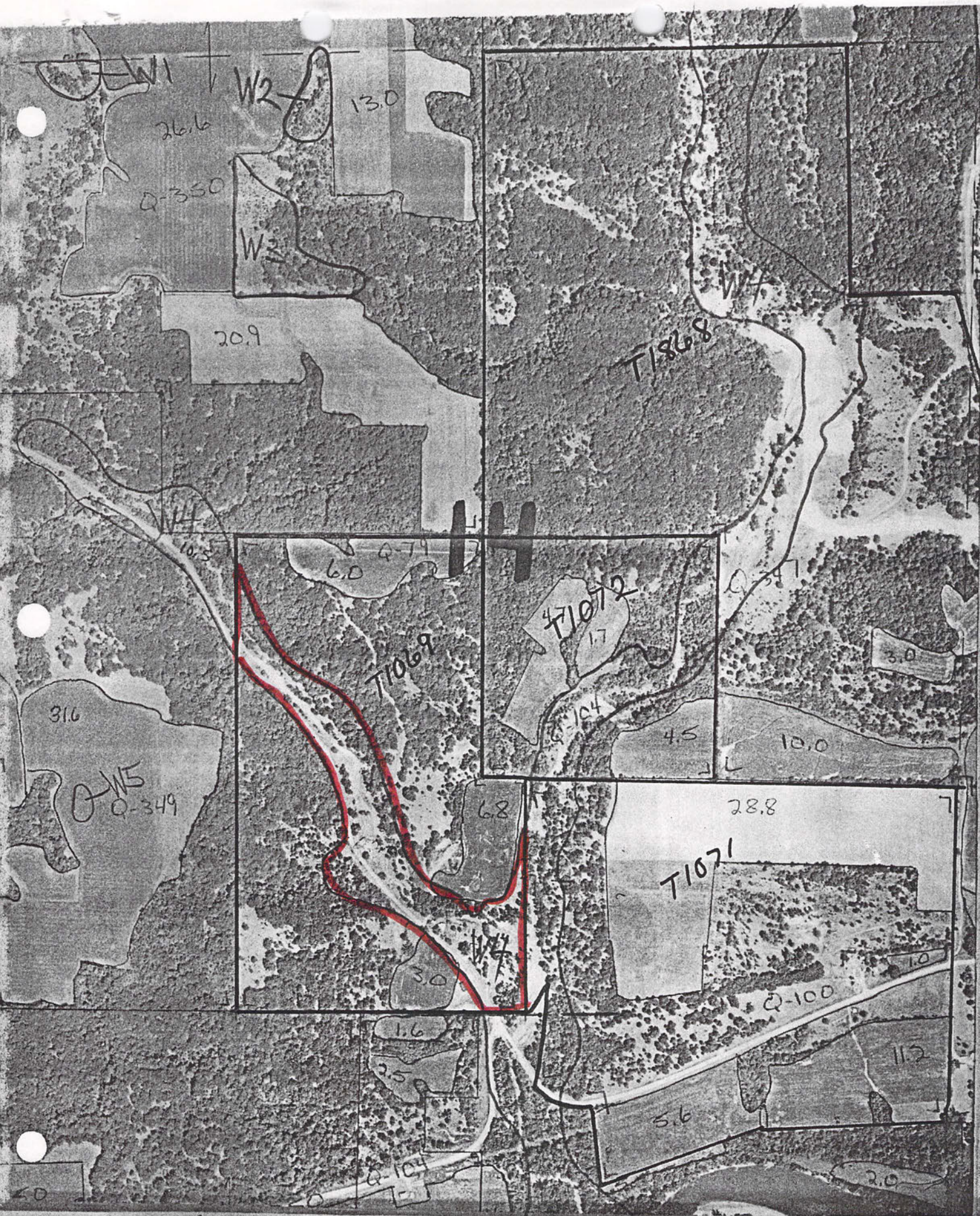

FINAL NOTICE

The 1985 Food Security Act requires owners and operators of Highly Erodible Land (HEL) to complete a conservation plan on HEL fields by January 1990. If you desire to remain eligible for USDA benefits, a plan must be fully implemented by January 1, 1995.

Some of the USDA programs affected are: 1. Price and income support 2. Crop Insurance 3. Farmer's Home Administration 4. Commodity Credit Corporation storage payments 5. Farm storage facility loans 6. Conservation Reserve Program annual payments and 7. Disaster payments.

If you do not complete a conservation plan by January 1, 1990, and wish to participate in one of the above USDA programs in a subsequent year, you will need to develop a conservation plan and have it fully implemented by the time you plant your crop in that program year.

Our records show that you have not yet completed a conservation plan on highly erodible fields in the following tract(s) #1069.

Dear Landuser:

The Food Security Act of 1985 (also known as the 1985 Farm Bill) has many far reaching provisions. One of these is called conservation compliance.

Conservation compliance means that you must be practicing good soil and water conservation measures in order to qualify for certain U.S. Department of Agriculture programs if you produce crops on highly erodible cropland. You must have a conservation plan or system approved by the Boone Soil and Water Conservation District. The following are the USDA programs affected by the conservation compliance provision:

- USDA price supports
- disaster payments
- crop insurance
- Farmers Home Administration loans
- farm storage facility loans
- other programs under which USDA makes commodity-related payments, including annual payments for the Conservation Reserve Program

The Boone Soil and Water Conservation District and the Soil Conservation Service are ready and willing to assist you in maintaining your eligibility for these USDA programs.

It has been determined that ASCS field numbers 2 are highly erodible fields based on the modern Soil Survey for Boone County. (See attached form SCS-CPA-026.)

Along with this letter, we are providing you with some conservation alternatives which will help you maintain your eligibility for the above mentioned programs. Please review these alternatives and select the one that best fits your system. We then request that you respond back to this office by November 1988 with your decision.
